



## Quick Connect and Threaded Fittings Identification




Tool needed:  
Flashlight




### Identifying the Connection



1. Using a flashlight, look under the sink to find the long hose that connects to the pullout wand. A flashlight might be needed. The hose will form "U" shape. Follow this hose to the side of the "U" shape where it connects to the bottom of the faucet.



2. There will be a shaft or a hose extending down from the faucet. This connects to the wand hose. If there is a shaft, this shaft will be metal and could be threaded or smooth.




3. If there is a metal threaded shaft, you should see a metal nut on the end of the wand hose that screws onto this threaded shaft. If this appears to be the fitting you have, you are done with the identification process. This fitting is called a “threaded connection”. If this is not the connection you have, please move on to step 4.



4. Inspect the hose or smooth metal pipe extending down from the faucet. There should be a black or white plastic fitting.



5. These are called “quick-connect fittings”. You can now identify this connection as a quick-connect fitting.
